Tim: A Pandemic Loss Becomes a Gain

When the lockdown began, like so many people, Tim was isolated – and that could have devastating consequences for his mental health. He could no longer work at the two locations he was used to going to every week. His counseling sessions with Monadnock Family Services were no longer in-person. He shared, *“At that moment, it (the lockdown) felt like a loss to me, but when I look back, it was a blessing.”*

Because of all the hard work with his MFS therapist Nan Roberto, MSW Tim had already begun the process of reconnecting with his family. For fifteen long years, his paranoia had prevented Tim from seeing his mom and siblings as the loving family they were. But because of his determination as well as the expertise and caring hearts of his MFS team, Tim was able to live with his mom during the lockdown.

Tim shared, *“Living with my mom for four and a half months was the first time I had lived with someone outside of the hospital or group home as an adult. It was with the help of my therapist that I was able to live with my mom.”*

“During this time, I learned things about myself that I never knew before. During those months, I grew in ways that I never imagined.”

Tim’s mom added, *“It was a truly transformative and healing time for him as well as for me. We connected on many levels I was deeply touched with how Tim’s MFS team supported him even without in-person visits. Tim could rely on daily calls from his therapist and others, just checking on him.”*

Tim stated, *“It felt like before the pandemic, there was a stay-at-home order put on me. I only left my apartment for essential reasons such as for MFS appointments and work.”* That is the effect mental illness can have on someone’s life. He went on to say, *“At my mother’s... I started to go for walks, go for errands, and practice driving with my mom. I was slowly overcoming my social anxiety.”*

While Tim has much to be proud of, he is probably most excited about having his own car for the first time. He shared, *“The biggest thing that gives me confidence along with freedom and independence is I have a car. Without the help of my family and my MFS therapist, I would not have one.”*

For people like Tim, it takes a great deal of courage to tell their stories. Those of us who are a part of Tim’s journey are deeply grateful for his decision to share this with our MFS supporters.

Lending a Hand

It has been a full year of change. As we adapted practices and services to continue reaching clients, we have been amazed by the resiliency and generosity of Monadnock Family Services (MFS) staff, clients, volunteers, and donors. Over the last year, we have witnessed countless ways our departments have worked together to problem-solve and go the extra mile to fulfill the most urgent needs of MFS clients.

ZOOM has proven to be a welcome and more accessible way to access services for many, as Adult Case Manager Chris Peterson noted, “I have found that I get more participation when doing telehealth or ZOOM sessions than I do in person.” Still, though, there remains a population of clients that are better suited to seeking services in-person and in those cases, we thought creatively to maintain the highest quality of services while also considering the health and safety of staff and clients. Knowing that being outdoors was likely to provide the safest in-person environment, some staff kept beach chairs in the trunk of their cars to be prepared should a client need to meet with them in person.

Just as this time of crisis called for adaptation in services, our staff recognized that some of our clients were facing other stressors that also impacted their physical and mental health. MFS staff stepped up and started grocery shopping for clients who were unable to leave their homes. With the Keene Community Kitchen unable to allow people in their building, we recognized that helping to deliver food to families facing food insecurity was necessary to help alleviate new barriers impacting the mental health of MFS clients. The Monadnock RSVP program answered our call to action and helped carry a load of food deliveries to local families. Reflecting on the volunteerism of Monadnock RSVP, Jessica Howard, Community Supports Director added, “Working with RSVP volunteers has been instrumental in keeping our clients fed

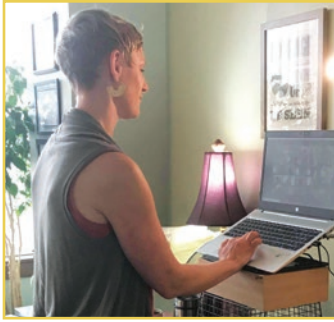

Trauma-Informed Training



Our clinical and support staff that work with children and families participated in a two-day internal training on Trauma-Informed Care. During the training staff members learned and worked together to understand the shared framework of trauma-informed, holistic care in order to create the best possible experience for the children and families we serve. Some of the topics explored in the training included racial trauma and body response, body-based regulation, and the stress response system, and the long-term effects created by the pandemic.

In October 2020 **100+ Women Who Care Monadnock** proved how individuals can come together to make a collective impact. Because of their generosity, our Monadnock Adult Care Center secured the remaining funding necessary to purchase new vans for transporting clients. Program Director, Chris Selmer highlighted the impact of this donation when she said, "We bring services to a very marginalized population in a region that has no public transportation and where there aren't a lot of community-based programs for adults who have medical, emotional, social, or developmental challenges,"

This year, MFS has also been touched by the generosity of businesses in our community. In the spring, MFS was the recipient of the Subaru Share the Love event at **Subaru of Keene**. MFS received a donation of \$20,000 that will go towards a new public health initiative called the Monadnock Assembly on Trauma and Transformation. The Assembly, a partnership between MFS and the Leadership Council for a Healthy Monadnock, is working to raise awareness about the impact of trauma and the paths people can take for their recovery. **Subaru's support of this project will help providers of care and family members become more competent in their efforts to help victims by offering the public educational programs and resources. This will mean that we all can build up a community of safety, trustworthiness, empowerment, collaboration, and peer support in a culture rich in diversity, equity, and inclusion.**



Men Who Cook

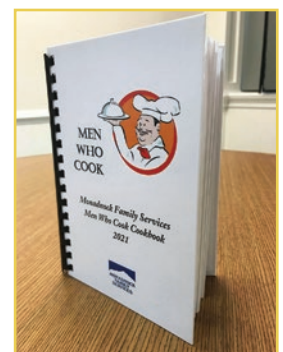

The Batchelder Society

In September 1905 on her property at 91 Court Street in Keene, Mrs. Alice Batchelder gathered some friends and acquaintances for a meeting that would grow to inspire her community for the next century. This meeting sparked what became known as the Associated Charities of Keene, now known as Monadnock Family Services.

The intentions of the original 28 concerned citizens live on today in the generosity of our donors. It was with this caring legacy in mind that we created The Batchelder Society, providing friends and supporters with the opportunity to create their own legacy to benefit MFS.

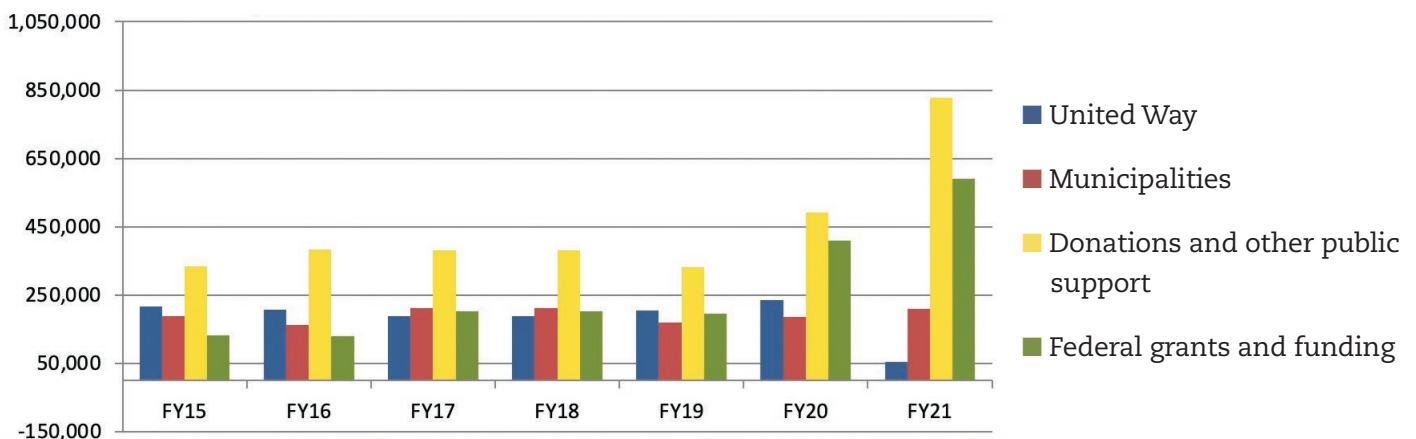

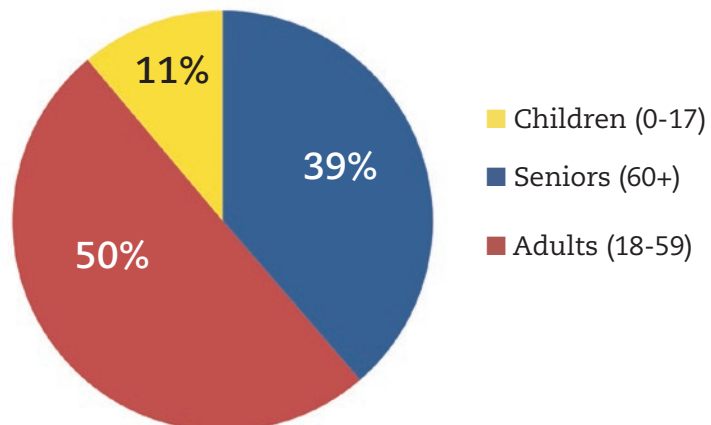
