As MFS continues to prepare for relocating our Keene service programs into our new location at 40 Avon St, we are creating a unique art project that speaks directly to our work and will adorn the main lobby of our building. In the large two-story entrance, we want to suspend 50 glass drops of water from the two-story ceiling. This installation has many meanings.

Since artworks have many interpretations, visitors will enter and might see 50 raindrops. Water is the most abundant substance on our planet, covering over 70% of the earth's surface. It is a source of life. When we are born, 78% of our body is water. Just as rain nourishes plants, water refreshes us. It is essential to the life of everything on our planet. It gives us energy. **We know instinctively that being near water makes us happy, reduces stress, and gives many a sense of peace.**


Perhaps visitors will look up and see 50 teardrops. We want the arrangement to serve as a reminder of our grief each time we lose a loved one and particularly of the sadness we all carry when someone dies by suicide.



No matter people's circumstances, the future can be better than the past. In the word of one of our clients, 'hope' stands for "hang on; pain ends."













Creating the Drops

"These teardrops are special because getting support from MFS is like turning your pain into beauty. Teardrops happen when you are in such a dark place and MFS turns those teardrops into strength and beauty. Doing the teardrop glass blowing there was a process before it turned into something beautiful and I feel that it's the same getting support from MFS. I remember I was in a lot of pain and suffering and there were a lot of tears, but now I feel like my true colors are out and my life is something I'm proud of."

The beauty and originality of each work of art matched the uniqueness of the stories that connected all of the participating artists to MFS.

Julie Bowen, an Incorporator and client at MFS, described the glass-blowing experience as, "The opportunity for me to honor my loved one who passed away from suicide, and to contribute to such a beautiful and meaningful art installation, is one I am forever grateful for."

We're looking forward to being able to display these works of art in our newly renovated space, with the knowledge that their beauty was made from people central to our mission of hope and healing.

MEET SHAR




At Monadnock Family Services, we are committed to addressing the mental wellness of individuals through a holistic lens. To us, this means helping people live to their full potential, expanding the boundaries of possibilities to prioritize what is meaningful to them. One of the ways the MFS supports clients' goals is by helping them achieve steady, meaningful employment. For some individuals, it can be hard to navigate the employment sector while maintaining necessary supplementary security income (SSI) or social security disability insurance (SSDI) benefits.

Shar Perham, our Certified Workplace Incentive Coordinator (CWIC) within our supported employment program, works with clients receiving other MFS services to do just that. In 2017 Shar began her career at MFS in a temporary role. Our culture of caring spoke to her after learning more about the mental health sector and having the personal experience of having a child who has mental health challenges. When her temporary position was coming to a close, she applied for a full-time position and later transitioned to becoming a CWIC.

"The goal of my job is to help clients maintain financial independence," said Shar, "Clients feel like their best selves when they work, and it can help boost their confidence." Shar takes pride in "meeting clients where they are" and helping navigate complex benefits systems so that they don't lose their support when returning to work.

"I focus on what clients can do, not what they can't," said Shar, "I recently had a client who was able to successfully increase her working hours to 30 a week. Working has improved her mental health by giving her something to focus on and helping to improve her interpersonal skills. She is proud of herself, and I am proud of her."

People like Shar embody the commitment to quality mental healthcare we pride ourselves on at MFS. Thank you, Shar, for helping our clients meet their wellness goals!

Many of you may remember me from last year when I shared my journey into recovery. I've had a deep appreciation for all that MFS has done for me. I can't thank the people I've worked with enough for helping me get to where I'm today.

I'm still a client at MFS who receives services through the ACT Team. I'm in remission. I've come to the realization that I am so much more then my mental illness. **My mental illness is only a part of who I'm and doesn't define me.** Realizing this helped me take control of my life again.

As I got better, I wanted to give back to the agency. In the fall of 2021, I was asked if I wanted to become an Incorporator. As I thought about it, it felt natural for me to continue sharing my journey into recovery. I was already fulfilling one of the roles of an Incorporator. **This made my decision to become an Incorporator easy.**

I was asked to take part in a glass blowing project (see page 1). It was to make a water drop. The cool thing about the one I made and all of the others is no two look identical. They remind me of how different each one of us is.
